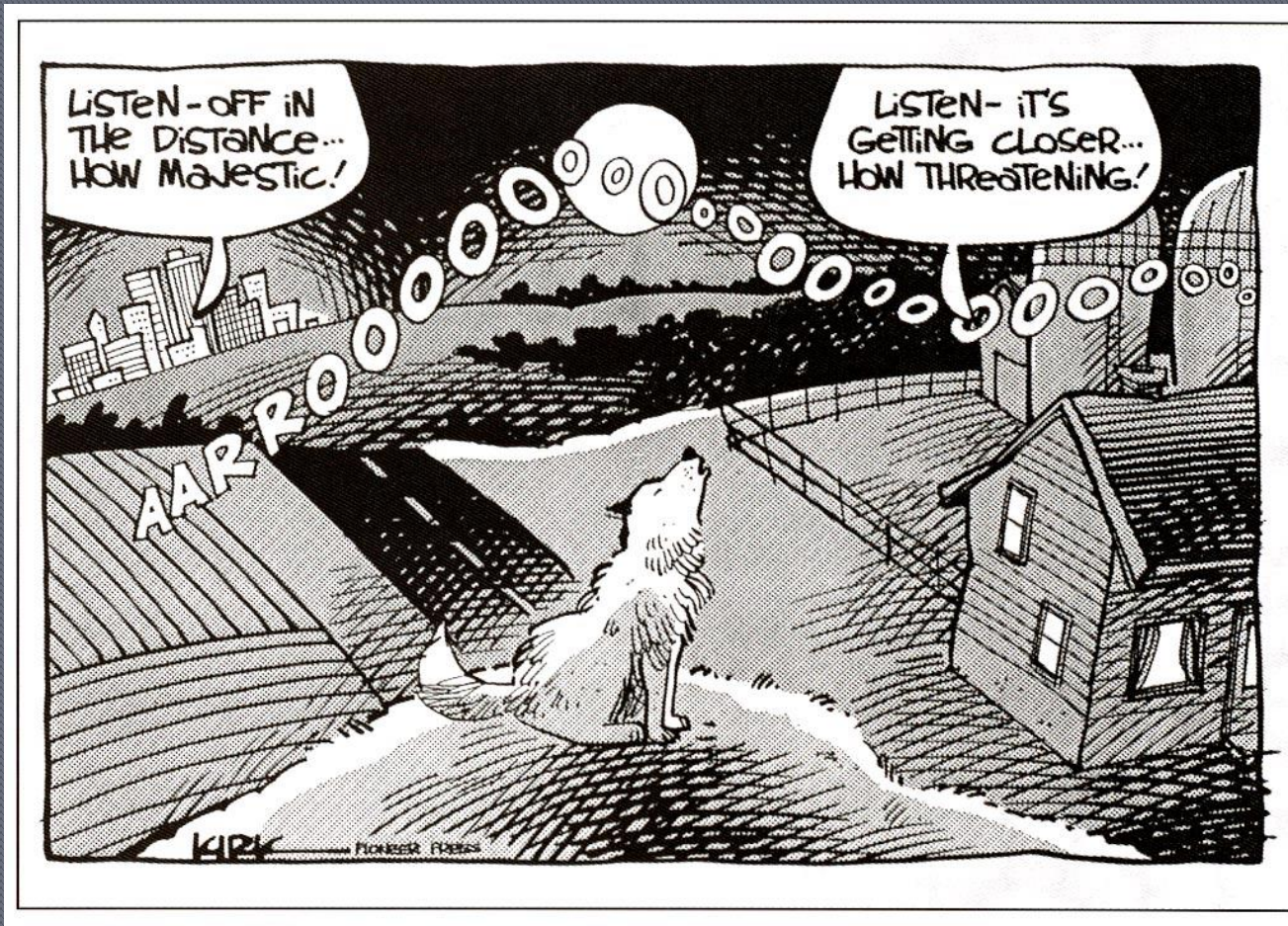
The context of European carnivore conservation

- The rural landscape
- Where people live, work, and play
- Where our history has occurred
- Where we try to preserve our cultural heritage
- Where we try to maintain our biodiversity
- This a multi-use landscape in its entirety.

The context of European carnivore conservation

- Rural life is changing dramatically
- Globalisation brings change
- Rural – urban migration
- Loss of people and power
- New values, new practices, new demands
- Challenges many of the “traditional” practices
 - Farming
 - Hunting
 - Forestry

Understanding conflicts

- The return of large carnivores to the rural landscapes leads to two main sets of conflicts.
- (1) With the real carnivores = material conflicts
- (2) With the symbolic carnivores = social conflicts

- Material / economic issues
- Depredation on livestock
- Bear damage to beehives
- Loss of life
- Killing of dogs

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Conflicts about knowledge

- Disputes over «facts»
- Different forms of knowledge – ways of knowing
- Scientific knowledge – vs local knowledge
- e.g. Fear and level of threat
- e.g. Numbers – how many carnivores are there?
 - Scale issues
 - Knowables and unknowables
- Knowledge is power!



Understanding conflicts

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Conflicts over values and norms

- Disputes about right and wrong and how the world should be!
- Modern vs traditional
- Rural vs urban
- Class
- Mans relationship with nature
 - Killing animals – hunting
 - The value of biodiversity
- Impact on your life project !!!

Example:

- Don't assume that hunters are at war with nature or hate wildlife

Conflicts types

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Conflicts about procedures

- Mainly about power and influence
- Who decides – and how?
- Issues of scale
 - Central vs local
- Issues of process
 - Participatory vs autocratic
 - Compromise vs consensus
 - Political vs technical
- Legislation

Understanding conflicts

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Conflicts concerning relationships

- About individuals – «I don't like your face!»
- Personal chemistry
- Trust and respect
- Schismogenesis

Understanding conflicts

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Conflicts are normally multi-faceted

Each stakeholder group experiences most dimensions – but to different extents.

Never underestimate how far these conflicts can escalate!



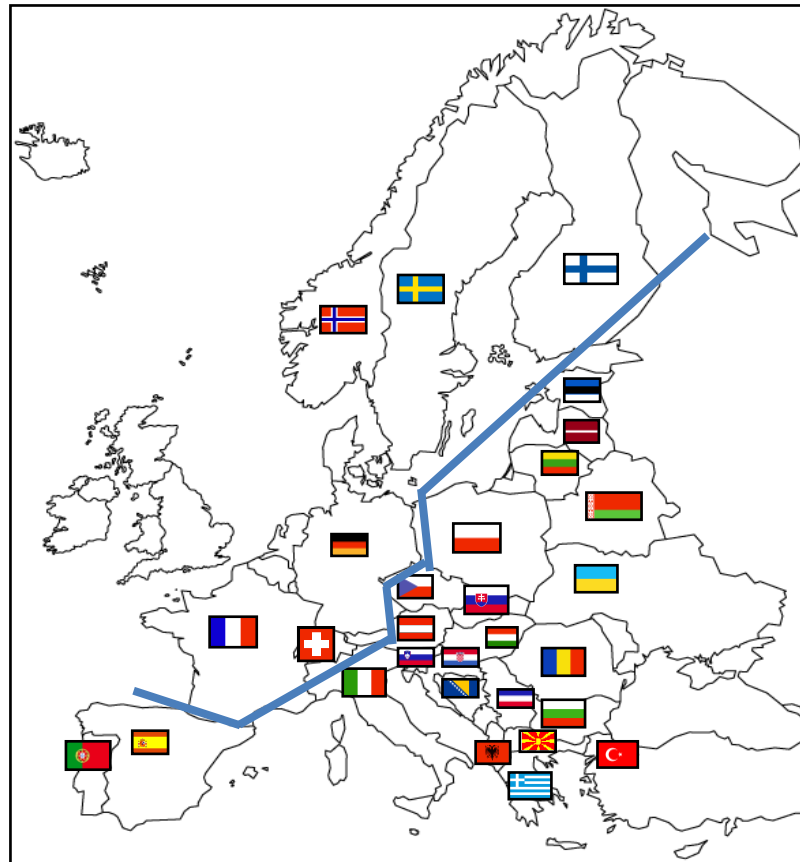
Understanding conflicts

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Conflicts can vary hugely

- Two Europes – old and new
- Variation with time



Recovery of Europe's large carnivores

- Limitations?
- Not habitat directly
- Conflict and tolerance = culture and tradition – especially among rural public
- Institutions / agencies to manage them

Recovery of Europe's large carnivores

- Addressing conflicts?
- Some can be addressed with technical measures – like livestock protection measures
- Most require dealing with individual people's perceptions and group power dynamics
 - People
 - Politics
